Antigone belonged to the Oedipus cycle. Antigone was introduced in 441 B.C., Oedipus Rex in 430 B.C., and Oedipus at Colonus in 401 B.C. (after Sophocles' death). Thus, Sophocles did not follow the tradition of Aeschylus' in presenting interrelated themes as contest entries.
