Critical Reading Reading for academic purposes requires reading for information and main ideas and, more importantly, reading to respond to and evaluate the ideas in a text, as you actively consider what you're reading. On the other hand, critical reading is based on active reading because you actively engage with the text, which means thinking about the text before you begin to read it, asking yourself questions as you read it as well as after you have read it, taking notes or annotating the text, summarizing what you have read, and, finally, evaluating the text.

Critical reading means that a reader applies certain processes, models, questions, and theories that

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result in enhanced clarity and comprehension. There is more involved, both in effort and understanding, in a critical reading than in a mere "skimming" of the text. What is the difference?

Critical reading generally refers to reading in a scholarly context, with an eye toward identifying a text or author's viewpoints, arguments, evidence, potential biases, and conclusions. Critical reading means evaluating what you have read using your knowledge as a scholar.

Critical readers employ strategies including identifying the authors’ ideas even when they’re not stated directly, recognizing patterns, questioning, prioritizing ideas, and identifying and evaluating arguments as well as creating new arguments. Reading is an active process.
