Just like every other specimen of the Pyramid Texts, the Hymn to Ra, as archaic and difficult for us to connect with as it is, was meant to help the pharaoh in his afterlife journey. Ra had different names depending on the position of the sun – Khepri (or Kheprer in the translation below) for example represented the early morning sun.

The hymns were written with tremendous praise to the Creator, standing in awe of His power and glory: “You are the one God, / shining forth from your possible incarnations / as Aten, the Living Sun, / Revealed like a king in glory, risen in light, / now distant, now bending nearby, / You create numberless things of this world / from yourself, who are One alone” (Akhenaten 45-46).

The Great Hymn to the Aten is the longest of a number of hymn-poems written to the sun-disk deity Aten. Composed in the middle of the 14th century BC, it is variously attributed to the 18th Dynasty Pharaoh Akhenaten or his courtiers, depending on the version, who radically changed traditional forms of Egyptian religion by replacing them with Atenism. The ancient Egyptian term for the disk of the sun was Aten, which is first evidenced during the Middle Kingdom, though of course solar worship begins much earlier in Egyptian history. It should be noted however that this term initially could be applied to any disk, including even the surface of a mirror or the moon.

The Egyptian God Aten Before and After Akhenaten

Amun, the hidden one, was an egyptian god, a sun-god, supreme god of creation, lord of the sky, and king of the Egyptian world.He was one of eight Egyptian deities composing the ogdoad in the Hermopolitan Theological System who represented chaos. He is one of the four masculine deities who had heads of frogs representing their apparent self-creation.

Aten also Aton, Atonu, Itn (Ancient Egyptian: jtn, reconstructed) was the focus of Atenism, the religious system established in ancient Egypt by the Eighteenth Dynasty pharaoh Akhenaten.The Aten was the disc of the sun and originally an aspect of Ra, the sun god in traditional ancient Egyptian religion, but Akhenaten made it the sole focus of official worship during his reign.
